principles:

- Learning ultimately supports the well-being of the self, the family, the community, the land, the spirits and the ancestors
- Learning is holistic, reflexive, reflective, experiential, and relational
- · Learning involves recognizing the consequences of one's actions
- · Learning involves generational roles and responsibilities
- Learning recognizes the role of Indigenous knowledge
- · Learning is embedded in memory, history, and story
- · Learning involves patience and time
- · Learning requires exploration of one's identity
- Learning involves recognizing that some knowledge is sacred and only shared with permission and/or in certain situations

The English Skills Development program aims to incorporate culturally responsive content and materials to enhance sense of belonging and First Peoples Principles of Learning.

- -Achieve the expected learning outcomes of the provincial curriculum by focusing on language and literacy
- -Develop individual potential
- -Acquire the language proficiency skills, and learning strategies and interpersonal skills needed to succeed in school and contribute positively to society



### English Skills Development SERVICES



English Skills Development services are delivered in-class by an ESD specialist or occur with the guidance of an ESD specialist.

Services may be delivered in a number of ways, including (but not limited to):

- Direct skill-building instruction to an individual learner, small group or class
- Additional co-teaching or team teaching services in class
- Consultative support to a classroom teacher
- -Adaptation and/or supplementary curriculum materials

Student progress will be shared during regular reporting periods (December, March and June).
